SKILLS AND KNOWLEDGE TO BE EVALUATED:

- The Grade 10 - 11 contest will be based on ability and creativity.

Equipment and Materials supplied by Committee:

Each contestant will be supplied with a table, mirror, mannequin (Long Hair) and single electrical outlet provided for their use.

Mannequin description: Dannyco/Man 2-B --- Length 14", Medium Brown

Equipment and Materials competitors must supply:

- Their own working tools: water spritzer bottles, sprayer towels, capes, combs, brushes, bobby pins, elastics, clips, hairpins, etc. (hair dryers must not require more than 1600 watts). Note: NO SCISSORS, cutting the hair on the mannequin will not be allowed. If caught cutting the mannequin hair you will be disqualified.
- Must bring his/her preferred types of styling products

JUDGING CRITERIA

- All judging will be performed according to the IVTO Objective Marking System.
- The contestants with the most points from the test will be the winner, the second highest mark will be placed second, and the third highest mark will be third.
- Demerits will be given for any rule infractions.
- Any communication between audience and competitor during the contest times will be seen as coaching and could cause demerit points to be awarded.

Project: Creative Braiding

Objective:

The contestant will use their imagination in order to create a style, which incorporates a minimum of two braid types, covering 75% of the head and best displays their artistic ability. The style would still be acceptable for a client to wear to a special occasion but should not be fantasy.

- Hair must be completely dry and brushed through at the beginning of the contest.
- The competitors will handle hair confidently, brush, comb, and part hair correctly, and create the braids of their choice.
- Bobby pins, ribbons, jewellery and ornaments may be used to enhance the design. Ornamentation must not cover more than 1/3 of the head. (Hair pieces or ornaments made of hair will not be allowed).

Judging Criteria:

- The difficulty, cleanliness, balance and form will form the basis of the judging for this competition.
- All judging will be performed according to a criterion-based system.
- Demerits may be given for any rule infractions.
- Any communication between audience and competitor during contest times may be seen as coaching and could cause demerits to be awarded.
